Type one	If the weather is nice	we will go for a walk.
	present tense	future tense
Type two	If the weather was nice	we would go for a walk.
	past tense	present conditional
Type three	If the weather had been nice	we would have gone for a walk.
	past perfect tense	past conditional

Type one	If I see you	I will say you hello.
Type two	If I saw you	I would say you hello.
Type three	If I had seen you	I would have said you hello.
