#### DISCIPLES ALONE

- In this chapter she describe her life way.
- She joined the convent, who left after 18 months.
- She tried to live by the Gospel story about a young man and possessing a lot of property.

- Sheila draws attention to a problem that can occur when each day, each free time, each weekend we work and we have not more time for our friends.

• "It is so easy, if one is single, to work during the day and get caught up (uviznout) in meeting, conferences and good works in evenings and weekends so that when one does suddenly find the evening is free there is a devasting void and sense of lonneliness (osamělost) that leaves one feeeling worthless, stupid and unvolved."

#### PRAIYNG ALONE

- This chapter deals with the importance of linking work with prayer
- People who believe in God do not need to enter the monastery to be able to pray.

#### CONTEMPLATIVE LIFE

- What is meaning word contemplative?
- Two categgories: acitve, contemplative
- To better understand it divides into two categories: active and contemplative life. She likens it to the New Testament figures of Mary and Martha.
- Active life Marthas. This life is associated with such activities, such as nursing, teaching or other pastoral activity.
- Contemplative life Mary. Contemplative life is associated with a special call to prayer with a higher calling. They leave the world in order to devote (zasvětit) his life entirely (zcela, úplně) to God.

### HOW DO PEOPLE PRAY?

- For human is prayer important. No matter how we pray, but we have to pray. Prayer can help us in service to others.
- Prayer should be part of our day, to pray for everything we do.
- In particular, it is not a question of work and prayer, but a life in which both are inexorably (neúprosně)linked together, a prayer gives strength to the service washing of the feet, leading to the sweetness (sladkost) of the rest in the presence of God.
