Although / Though

However / Nevertheless

In spite of / Despite

In spite of the fact that / Despite the fact that

Although / though I was tired, I went on working.

I was tired, **nevertheless / however** I went on working.

In spite of being tired, I went on working.

Despite being tired I went on working.

In spite of the fact that I was tired, I went on working.

Despite the fact that I was tired, I went on working.

However tired I was, I went on working.
