It is true that a smile means more or less the same thing in any language, even though the things that make people smile may be very different. Laughter and crying also have universal meanings. It is equally true that there are many similarities in the ways in which humans and animals show their feelings.

Fear and surprise are other emotions that are often shown in much the same way all over the world. A phrase like 'he went pale and began to tremble' suggests that the man was either afraid or had just had a nasty shock in any language.

Nevertheless, even surprise is not always easy to recognize. In Chinese, this emotion can be described in a phrase like 'they stretched out their tongues'. In a language like English, however, sticking out your tongue usually has a different meaning.

Even in the same culture, people differ in their ability to interpret and express feelings. 4 The same studies suggest that body language – the way we suggest our feelings in our physical movements and posture – is another problem. Older people in North America seem to find it easier to interpret than younger people.

In another famous experiment, there was clear evidence that the most difficult feeling of all to interpret is physical pain. 5 They could see only her face. She later died. However, more than ninety per cent of the audience believed she was experiencing great physical pleasure.

Psychologists such as E.G. Beier have also shown that some people often give completely the wrong impression of how they feel. 6 When they try to show interest, it seems to others that they are indifferent. This can happen even among close friends or members of the same family. In other words, what you think you communicate through words and body language may be the exact opposite of what other people actually understand.
